

Connecting Communities: Towards open, free and sustainable citizen communication

Universidad de las Américas, Quito, 24th-25th of July 2017

Call for papers

Network and Internet culture has been built on non-state, non-proprietary organizational models, making possible the widespread use of digital technologies. However, the neoliberalization of technology has limited its access beyond industrialized countries. In addition, access to technology does not necessarily guarantee its equal distribution or use within communities. Current approaches to technology also often overlook its relation to the wider ecology of communities. This two-day symposium will take a closer look at the use of digital communication at the community level. The symposium will also engage the perspectives of social movement actors concerned with free and open software and knowledge, as well as ancestral and less main stream approaches to technology in order to consider issues of sustainability and biodiversity, within the context of the use of digital communication and social networks in local community projects.

The symposium aims to provide opportunities for practitioners, indigenous communities and academics to share experiences, interdisciplinary theoretical and methodological tools, and best practices in relation to digital technologies, community media and the documentation of indigenous languages and cultures. Both individual and panel submissions are welcome. A panel submission is one in which a group of colleagues propose a coherent theme to be discussed by multiple speakers. Papers, posters or other formats (e.g. film and animation) are welcome. Proposals should be submitted in the form of a 200-250 word abstract and aim to fit within one of the following themes:

- 1. Methodologies and approaches to knowledge and information sharing: Case studies and proposals of how indigenous, urban and rural communities have adapted diverse technologies for community use.
- 2. Legislative challenges in the current context: The legislation and use of Information and Communication Technologies (ICTs) and community media for enhancing citizen participation and community organizing as well as the promotion of community values.
- 3. Media activism, citizens' media and popular communication tools, strategies, challenges.
- 4. Use of audiovisual methodologies to document, promote, and strengthen indigenous languages, knowledges and cultures.
